

PAPAYA - Phytosanitary Requirements for Commodities Granted Market Access by Various Countries

Country of Import	Country of Export	Phytosanitary Requirements
Europe	All countries	This commodity is allowed entry into Europe No Treatment is required but must be free from any pest and disease But the pesticide residue level permitted must be according to European Food Safety Authority Standards -EC Directive EC 396 / 2005 - MRL on pesticides need to be followed If a pesticide is not included in any of the above mentioned Annexes the default MRL of 0.01 mg/kg applies (Art 18(1b) of Reg. (EC) No 396/2005).
Japan	All countries	This commodity is prohibited entry into Japan
S. Korea	All countries	This commodity is prohibited entry into S. Korea
China	Malaysia Thailand Philippines	Phytosanitary Certificate Hot Water Treatment (Core Temperature of 46.5°C for 10 minutes) The treatment must be approved by the respective Agriculture Department and AQSIQ, China Ventilation holes in the packing boxes should be covered with mesh wire with 32 mesh size metting
Singapore	All countries	Phytosanitary Certificate No Treatment is required but must be free from any pest and disease
Hong Kong	All countries	Phytosanitary Certificate No Treatment is required but must be free from any pest and disease
Australia	Fiji,	Import Permit Required 1. Only fresh Fijian papaya (<i>Carica papaya</i>) fruit, varieties Sunrise Solo and Waimanalo Solo sourced from the main Fijian island of Viti Levu will be permitted into Australia. 2. Mandatory preshipment treatment: Only papaya fruit that has undergone High Temperature Forced Air (HTFA) treatment for disinfestation against fruit flies are allowed -during the HTFA treatment fruit must be held at a pulp temperature at or above 47.2°C for twenty minutes while being monitored using fruit probes that have been calibrated prior to the season beginning. 3. Consignments of papaya from Fiji must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate issued by the Fiji MASLR. The Phytosanitary Certificate must have the following: a) additional declarations stating that: "the papaya in this consignment has been inspected and found free from any visually detectable quarantine pests as specified by Biosecurity Australia and has undergone HTFA treatment as specified by Biosecurity Australia". b) mandatory preshipment High Temperature Forced Air Treatment (HTFA) details such as duration and temperature of treatment included in the treatment section on the Phytosanitary Certification, or have the treatment record on a letterhead from the treatment provider attached to the Phytosanitary Certificate. c) grower and packhouse registration numbers included in the Phytosanitary Certificate. d) the shipping container, the seal and the boxes or cartons numbers.
